

## ROTARY BRISTLE SELECTION GUIDE

We offer a full range of bristle choices ranging from soft to stiff and everything in between of nylons, polypropylenes, wire, grit, and natural fibers. When determining bristle types consider the following factors: speed, down pressure, choice of chemicals to be used, soil level and floor conditions.

The following chart is a helpful guide that shows types of bristles typically used on the described floors. Use chart as a reference. Better Brush is not responsible for damage done to floors when the wrong product is used for the application.
